

Company Updates as of March 2008

1. Syringex: The 1, 3, 5, and 10cc syringes are now qualified, meaning they can now be mass produced. We have large molds for each size. The last of the molds should be on their way to the factory in China this week, except for the new collar mold. That should be done shortly. The prototype mold for the 1cc insulin syringe is in progress. They would also like to make another 3cc barrel and piston mold set incorporating improvements we have made to our process and with the new and improved staff we have at our mold shop. We sent over two of our best guys from the mold shop to the manufacturing facility to get things moving there. So, just maybe, we'll get production up and running in the very near future. John Jones recently had a meeting with our Chinese joint venture partners in Toronto around the 10th of February to see if we can work out the rest of the details of our working relationship. I understand they are now thinking of some ownership in Syringex. I don't, however, know the extent of what they are thinking about.
2. United Aerospace has filed its patent on our tag-a-long coupling technology (see attachment). We've aligned ourselves with Hammerlock <http://www.hammerlock.com/> for manufacturing in China and I gave the go ahead to build the molds for two different coupling systems and to build several proto-types of both couplers. We're also in the negotiating stages of aligning ourselves with Life Long Locks to market the couplers <http://www.lifelonglocks.com/>. These guys came out of marketing from Nabisco and have been doing a great job with their locking product, in fact we've designed our couplers to accept their locks. My understanding is that Accuride wants to market the products as well www accuridecorp.com – once we're in full production. I expect to be in full production some time this summer. And our DOT testing overall was very successful and we'll be hopefully concluding the DOT testing some time in April. We've also introduced the NASA coupling technology to Accuride and a larger defense contractor for military application.

Progress is being made on all fronts. We've had plenty of stumbling blocks and we (all of the people I'm surrounded by) expect more, however most importantly is that progress is being made and nobody on my team is giving up – nobody. I think that's a great indication for an investor – none of us get rich without you getting rich too.
